Quackenbush Farm started in 2014 as a partnership between four young friends with a passion for good food and desire to connect with the land and local community. Without access to capital to purchase land, they started the adventure instead by renting and sharing a home on five well-suited acres. Currently, they farm 1.5 acres of diversified vegetables, with a large portion devoted to growing heirloom varieties. These farmers have much to share on renting versus owning land as beginning farmers, farming on a budget, and developing community partnerships to support their efforts.
